Packing Your Parachute Properly

The other morning, I was sitting outside on the back patio at my house, having my devotional time, when I noticed a commotion overhead. Eventually, I located the source of the disturbance. A squirrel was busily—and noisily—adding fresh leaves and new sticks to its nest in the tree above me. Up the trunk, down the branch, across from one bough to another, this little squirrel scurried around, snapping twigs and gathering up

what it needed to winterize its home before the weather turns too cold—which, at some point, it will.

Watching the diligent squirrel at work, I thought: “This is what we do in the fall. We prepare. We get ready. It’s just that time of year.”

Jesus has a lot to say about getting ready. In Matthew 24:36-25:13, he tells three different parables, one after the other, about servants who are, with varying degrees of success, watching and waiting and preparing for the return of their Master. Jesus also tells of the consequences of failure when the Master comes back to find his servants unready for his arrival. All three parables illustrate the same basic point: Followers of Jesus need to live obediently, and in accordance with his teachings, so that they will be found faithful when he returns. “Keep awake, therefore,” Jesus says at the end of one of these parables, “for you know neither the day nor the hour” (Matthew 25:13).

And that’s the thing about preparation: Most of the time, we don’t know the exact day, or the precise hour, when the time for getting ready will suddenly come to an end. Insurance policies, retirement accounts, fire drills, CPR training, and so forth: We’re used to preparing for events that may happen at unexpected times—or may never happen at all. That squirrel, though, is doing its prep work now, while there are still plenty of leaves on the tree to work with. Soon enough, the time will come to stop building that cozy nest and, instead, begin living in it.

There’s a book on my shelf called *Building a Life With God*. I don’t think I’m simplifying things too much to say that it’s a book about spiritual preparation: Building a life, a relationship, an intimacy with God. Building a way of listening to, relying on, and placing trust in God. Building habits that will sustain us when—on an unexpected day, or at an unforeseen hour—we suddenly find ourselves needing what only God can provide. When you’re falling out of an airplane, it’s a little late to start learning how to pack a

parachute properly.

So, this fall—this season of the year when nature tells us to get ready—I encourage you to set aside some time to reflect upon this question: How are you building a life with God right now? How’s your spiritual prep going? Are you worshipping regularly? Praying faithfully? Sharing generously? Serving obediently? Listening intently to the Holy Spirit’s whisper in your heart? Without these spiritual practices, we are much more liable to lapse into what Lauren Winner calls “spiritual narcissism,” a chronic condition in which we replace God at the center of our universe.

In a sense, we spend our entire lives getting ready for what comes next. There is, obviously, an abundance—a cornucopia, to use a good November word—of ways we can spend our precious prep time. There are always plenty of things that will demand our attention, distract us, and promise to entertain, amuse, or excite us. Not all of these things, however, are worthy of our time and energy. The wise person—like the wise squirrel—gets ready for what truly matters.

May the peace of Christ be with you!

Gathered for Worship

Last month, in my article “Called to Worship,” I discussed that worship is about so much more than our corporate meetings. It is a biblical mandate on how we should live our lives. Worship is the proper response to our God who has given us everything. We should live every moment of our lives in accordance with this law. To live in such a way requires practice. Our Sunday gatherings for worship become the obvious rehearsal space. Now, let us explore how we worship as a community by first discussing the Gathering.

“Christians are called by God to worship, to do so with one another and in the company of Jesus Christ.” Jesus said, “where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them” (Matthew 18:20). This biblical emphasis on joining together in fellowship (gathering together) is highlighted further in Hebrews: “and let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together . . . but encouraging one another” (Hebrews 10:24-25). Great importance should be placed on the fellowship because it specifically brings us together in community – the image of God.

Those who love God through Christ are on the way to fulfilling this purpose, as he conforms them to the likeness of the Son, Jesus Christ, who is the image of God. This conforming process involves becoming a community that exemplifies the love found within God himself, that is, the love among the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. As image bearers of God, we should seek to show hospitality to all. This way of life as described in Romans 12:13 and Hebrews 13:16 should be evident in our corporate gatherings no matter how difficult to achieve. Koinonia [fellowship] is a privilege of Christian life unparalleled by any other affiliation. This unique quality is highly relevant in today’s society, where community

is desirable. Those who are unable to find it in their broken world may gravitate toward a body where it is boldly displayed.

So as the church, we must know the answer to the question: “Why do people come to worship?” Our understanding of the Word must propel us to live into it – “that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ” (1 John 1:3). Fostered by the work of the Holy Spirit the answer becomes evident. “Worship meets two profound human needs, the need for communion with God and the need for human community . . . People are drawn to worship not only to be in the presence of God but also to be in the presence of other people.” The focus is not on how we gather (e.g. procession, greeting, invocation) but rather on the importance of gathering together in community. The emphasis as pointed out in Ephesians 4 should be on the building up of the body of Christ. “Edification occurs when Christians minister to one another in word and deed, seeking to express and encourage a Christ-centered faith, hope and love.”

Next month, we will explore the second part of our worship service – The Word.





This position is not classified as a ministerial post by our Personnel Manual, so a formal search committee is not required. However, because the church administrator is a very important role at Providence Baptist Church, the Personnel Committee will be working closely with Senior Pastor Lee Canipe to develop an appropriate profile for the position, which ultimately will be presented to potential candidates. The Committee will also provide support to Lee during the hiring process so that, together, we can identify and select the best qualified individual for the job.

Until a new church administrator begins work at Providence, the Personnel Committee has asked Providence Facilities Manager Rocky Cannon to serve as Interim Church Administrator. With 28 years of experience as church administrator in other congregations, Rocky is quite familiar with what the position requires and is fully qualified to manage the operations at Providence. With Rocky working alongside our operations team of Amy Shoemaker, Summer Sneed, Beverly Tucker, and Jim Tucker, we are confident that the church's day-to-day affairs are in good hands during this interim period.

As we move forward, I will be working closely with Finance Committee Chair Dan Perrone and the administrative staff to ensure the church's ministries continue to receive the support they need.
